WHAT DOES THE WIAT III MEASURE?

Exercise	Measures
Listening Comprehension	Making inferences and remember details from oral sentences
Early Reading Skills	Naming letters, letter sounds and understanding of reading
Reading Comprehension	Literal and inferential understanding of written text
Maths Problem Solving	Maths problem solving skills
Alphabet Writing Fluency	Ability to write the alphabet
Sentence Composition	Writing sentences
Word Reading	Speed and accuracy of single word reading
Essay composition	Spontaneous written expression
Pseudoword Decoding	Ability to decode nonsense words

HOW DOES I-PASS USE THIS INFORMATION?

We can identify a student's **age-related levels in years and months.** For example reading age is 6 years 9 months.

Analysis of the student's performance **pinpoints specific targets** for them to achieve by the end of the year. These targets are broken down into short term objectives to achieve as soon as possible. The purpose of these targets is to **close the attainment gap** between the student and their peers.

Combining the information from the WIAT III with information from the WISC V allows for a deeper analysis which can identify specific learning difficulties such as **Dyslexia and Dyscalculia.**
